

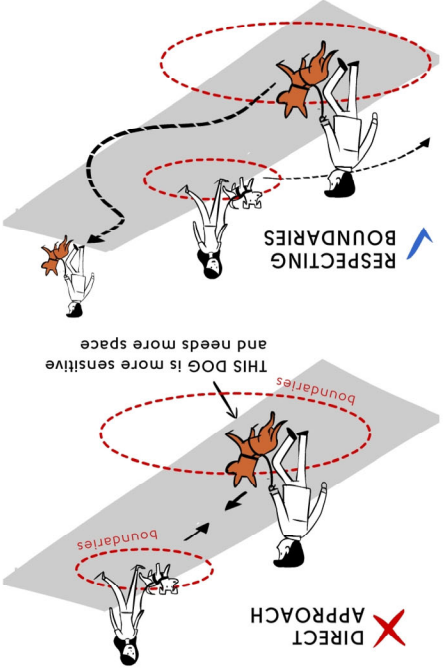
Just like people, dogs have different sociability levels with other dogs. A dog's social tolerance is flexible and changes over time.

Some dogs may need MORE SPACE because:

- they have health issues
- they are in training
- they are scared or reactive around other dogs
- they are old and just want to be left in peace

You can help them by respecting their need for personal space.
