

By-Laws change to allow an increase in Membership

ARTICLE IV – MEMBERSHIP (Amended, 10/19/2021)

Membership requires the possession of a valid Driver's License. An awareness of the needs of veterans is essential. It is the policy of the Corporation to provide membership without regard to race, color, sex, age, disability, religion, nation of origin or marital status.

Membership in the Corporation shall be open to all current, retired, or former members of the United States Armed Forces. Ownership or lease of a Corvette is required.

Membership is also open to any individual having an immediate family relationship to a current, retired, or former (including deceased) member of the United States Armed Forces. This relationship can be by grandparent, parent, spouse, sibling or children. Ownership or lease of a Corvette is required.

Drive your Corvette to Work Day

July 1, 2022

Drive Your Corvette to Work Day is celebrated every year on the Friday that is closest to June 30 the day the first Corvette was produced — this year it falls on July 1. The first 300 Corvettes were all Polo White convertibles with black canvas tops and red interiors and produced at the facility in Flint. Since then, millions of Corvettes have been produced. This day is perfect to travel in style to work in your precious Corvette.

HISTORY OF DRIVE YOUR CORVETTE TO WORK DAY

The Corvette has been in existence since the early 1950s and years after the first car was rolled out, it still remains a favorite for speed and acceleration. People mostly drive Corvettes on beautiful days for a joy ride. To change this, this day was started by Mike Yager, the founder of Mid America Motorworks, in 2001. He started this tradition to have as many Corvettes on the road that day to celebrate the birth anniversary of the car and transform the everyday work commute into an ode to America's sports car.

Mike Yager was quoted saying, "We understand why many owners consider their Corvette to be a special car and only drive it occasionally but we think driving your Corvette to work, at least one day a year, is an excellent way to demonstrate just how popular Corvettes are. And it is a chance for Corvette owners to meet new Corvette owners."

The Corvette was christened by Chevrolet's photographer, Myron Scott. He opened a dictionary to find a word starting with 'C,' to get a name with an alliterative effect. He chanced upon 'corvette,' which is a name for a small, fast, and easy-to-maneuver warship. To add to the Corvette's popularity, the car has also started in a

popular TV show from the 1960s called "Route 66." It followed the journey of two people in their 20s traveling cross-country in a Chevy Corvette. General Motors supplied a new Corvette for each season of the show, which aired from 1960 to 1964. The show also found a place in the Corvette fan club magazine.

Over the years, the car has only become more desired and holds a special place in people's hearts. On this day, grab the opportunity to bring your Corvette out on the road and share the love.

Extremely Rare 1971 Corvette ZR2 Convertible Heads to Auction

A rare and never restored 1971 Chevrolet Corvette ZR2 Convertible will be sold at Mecum Auctions in May. As a highly original and one of only two ZR2 convertibles on the planet, it could go for over \$1 million.



One of Two on the Planet

The week of May 13-21, a rare <u>1971 Chevrolet Corvette ZR2 Convertible</u> will hit the auction block at a <u>Mecum Auctions</u> sales event. It is expected to go for a price between \$1 million and \$1.2 million. Why? Chevrolet's asking price at the time the 1971 Corvette ZR2 was released was \$7,672, which is \$54,400 today. Given that price tag, only 12 buyers made a purchase—two of which were convertibles.



Built for Performance

Chevrolet built the 1971 Corvette ZR2 Convertible with high-performance factory components. It featured an AC/Delco ignition system and a powerful 454 LS6 V8 engine with up to 425 horsepower. The ZR2 also had an <u>M22 "Rock-Crusher" 4-speed manual transmission</u>, a high-capacity aluminum radiator, and J56 dual-pin heavy-duty power brakes.

Best-Handling Big Block

Equally equipped with F41 heavy-duty suspension with special springs, shock absorbers, and front and rear stabilizer bars, the ZR2 achieved the status of one of the **<u>best-handling big-block</u>** Corvettes Chevrolet manufactured. Need more evidence that the ZR2 was built to perform? The ZR2 did not come with a radio or air conditioning.

Last Known LS6

One of the rarest big-block Corvettes in the marque's history, this ZR2 convertible is highlighted by Mecum Auctions as the last known LS6 and ZR2 car ever built by Chevrolet. The car's owner, **Ed Foss**, claims it is also the most original ZR2 in the world. It looks to be the only one that has never been restored.



Unbelievably Low Mileage

In addition to its uniquely original, unrestored condition, it is also the lowest mileage ZR2 known to exist. The car has been driven a mere 8,702 miles.



This rare ZR2 comes with full documentation: the **original vehicle purchase order**, **<u>shipping invoice</u>**, and the <u>original</u> <u>tank sticker</u>. Enthusiasts will be anxious to see who becomes the next lucky owner of this 1971 Corvette come May.

Corvette Racing Finishes Runner-Up to Pfaff Porsche in Canada



<u>Corvette</u> Racing finished runner-up to Pfaff Motorsports in Sunday's <u>Chevrolet</u> Grand Prix from Canadian Tire Motorsport Park, securing an important points haul towards its GTD Pro class title bid in the process. Antonio Garcia described the two-hour, 20-minute race around the daunting 1.8-mile circuit as "perfect," from an execution standpoint, with the No. 3 Corvette C8.R simply lacking the pace to catch and pass Pfaff's No. 9 Porsche 911 GT3 R, which led the majority of the event.

"We finished second, and that's all we had," Garcia said post-race. "We pushed the winning car, but it wasn't enough. Next race, we'll try to go a little faster and do something different. This is what it also takes to win championships. So we need to stay in contact, and I'm sure the wins will come."



Jordan Taylor started the race from fourth in GTD, moving up a spot as one of the frontrunners spun off at Turn 1 and keeping pace with the two leaders for the duration of his one-hour, 40-minute stint. The American then pitted for fresh fuel and tires and to hand driving duties over to Garcia, with the Spaniard driving the remaining 40 minutes to close out the race. Garcia said he may have been able to close up to the Porsche if it weren't for two late-race caution periods, although the Pfaff team was also managing its pace throughout the closing laps.

"I think it felt like the Porsche was showing what they had to show," Garcia said. "Whenever we would stop saving fuel or tires, it felt like they had some in reserve. We thought that without those two yellows and a more consistent stint, maybe we would have had a chance. Up until the last yellow I was saving the tires, but on the last yellow, we knew it would be a race to the end. We both went 100 percent."

C8 Corvette Front Grille Screen Guards Accessory Now Available




The <u>C8 Corvette</u> offers impressive mid-engine performance ready to be unleashed at a moment's notice, and to keep everything running nice and cool, the exterior design incorporates large front air intakes. Of course, the size and location of these intakes means that vital cooling components could be damaged by road debris, so to mitigate the risk, <u>Chevy</u> is offering these new front grille screen guard accessories.



Available from Chevrolet Accessories and provided by Scrape Armor, the protective screens fit into the air intakes located in the front bumper of the <u>C8 Corvette Stingray</u>. The mesh grille incorporates a honeycomb design that works well with the rest of the front-end styling of the C8 Corvette, and neatly fit behind the standard intake insert. Finished in black, the screen is subtle, but should be effective at stopping any road debris kicked up ahead of the sports car as it travels down the road.

According to GM, the C8 Corvette Front Grille Screen Guards accessory was created using CAD data and 3Dformed to perfectly match the front intakes of the sports car. The mesh allows air to pass through, while still protecting the cooling elements underneath. There's also a quick-release fastener that allows the mesh to be quickly removed for cleaning or for track use. The grille has a black powder coated aluminum finish.



The accessory package is offered with two protective screens, one for the driver's side intake, and another for the passenger's side intake. The kit also includes the hardware required for installation, tools, and instructions.

Pricing for the kit is set at \$399.95, per the Chevy Accessories website. Dealer installation is listed as another \$225.
