By-Laws change to allow an increase in Membership

ARTICLE IV – MEMBERSHIP (Amended, 10/19/2021)

2023 Corvette Z06 Pricing, Order Date Revealed



The <u>Corvette</u> is renowned for offering world-beating levels of performance at a price point that significantly undercuts the competition, and *GM Authority* is happy to report this won't change with the <u>2023 Corvette</u> Z06.

<u>Chevy</u> just confirmed full pricing for the 2023 Corvette Z06, with the targa-topped Coupe in the entry-level 1LZ trim starting at an approachable \$106,395, including the mandatory destination freight charge. Pricing for the Coupe in the better-equipped 2LZ trim will start at \$115,595, while the Coupe in the range-topping 3LZ trim will start at \$120,245.

As expected, the Convertible is slightly more expensive. The 2023 Corvette Z06 Convertible in the entry 1LZ trim will start at \$113,895, while the 2LZ trim will start at \$122,595 and the 3LZ trim at \$127,245. The order books for the 2023 Corvette Z06 in both Coupe and Convertible body styles will open up on July 28th, 2022.

GM also confirmed the price of some of the Z06's options. The Z07 Performance Package will start at \$8,995, adding FE7 suspension, Brembo carbon ceramic brakes, Michelin Pilot Cup 2R ZP tires, and underbody strakes. This package will also require the customer to order either the Visible Carbon or Carbon Flash Painted aerodynamics packages, however, which are priced from \$10,495 and \$8,495, respectively. Customers who select these options can then go one step further and add the optional Carbon Fiber Wheels, which are also available with either a Visible Carbon Fiber or Carbon Flash Painted finish. The Visible Carbon wheels are priced from \$11,995, while the Carbon Flash painted wheels are slightly less at \$9,995.

Chevy rightly points out that the 2023 Corvette Z06 significantly undercuts rivals like the Audi R8, Porsche 911 GT3, Lamborghini Huracán Evo, Ferrari F8 Tributo and McLaren 720S, whilst offering similar levels of performance. GM's new flat-plane crank <u>5.5L LT6 V8</u> engine comes standard in the mid-engine supercar, pumping out 670 horsepower and 460 pound-feet of torque, with power sent to the rear wheels by way of an upgraded dual-clutch eight-speed automatic transmission. GM claims the supercar can hustle from zero to 60 mph in roughly 2.8 seconds and can reach a top speed of at least 188 mph.

How Chevrolet Made the C8 Corvette Z06 Engine Bomb-Proof

Recently, GM hosted an event where engineers from the Chevrolet Corvette and Small Block programs gave a threeplus-hour presentation on the LT6, the engine powering the new C8 Corvette Z06. The most common point of reference throughout was the LT4, the supercharged 6.2-liter V-8 used in the C7 Corvette Z06, and currently found in the Camaro ZL1 and Cadillac CT5-V Blackwing. It's a killer engine, though early on, it was plagued with faults. Related Stories

Namely, overheating. In track use, early C7 Z06s had a habit of hitting high engine temperatures and going into limp-home mode, something that led owners to file multiple class-action lawsuits against GM. Chevy fixed the problem by raising the supercharger cover starting with the 2017 Z06, but the damage to GM's reputation for building durable track cars was done. It was a rare miss for team Corvette, and while no one directly mentioned the LT4's issues in the LT6 presentation, the subtext was, "we know where we screwed up with the LT4-powered C7." (We should note that the LT4 hasn't shown heat-soak issues in the Camaro ZL1, the 3rd-generation Cadillac CTS-V, or the current CT5-V Blackwing. Cadillac's media launch for the CT5-V Blackwing was held at Virginia International Raceway last summer, and the cars presented no issues lapping all day in 95-degree heat with A/C on.) LT6 engineers spent lots of time talking about how they achieved such impressive figures with this all-new 5.5-liter V-8: 670 hp at 8400 rpm, 460 lb-ft of torque at 6300 rpm, and an 8600-rpm redline. But they dedicated just as much time to explaining the cooling system, and how the engine was made to be robust.

That starts with how the LT6 is constructed. The block is made of two separate aluminum castings: one for the cylinders, water jackets, and the upper half of the crankcase, the other forming the lower crankcase and holding the oil scavenging system. It's a highly unusual design—the vast majority of V-8s built since the Thirties use a single casting for block and crankcase.

This design was employed to maximize the efficiency of the dry-sump lubrication system. Casting the crankcase separately allowed Chevy to create four sealed crankcase bays, which help to keep air out of the system, allowing the crankshaft to spin more freely and reducing pumping losses. Each crank bay has what engineers call a "gun slit" to allow oil into an individual scavenge circuit. "It's critical in a high performance engine to not aerate the oil and get it out of the crankshaft," says Jordan Lee, chief engineer for GM Small Blocks. Aerated oil wreaks havoc on bearings, and the new crankcase design and dry-sump system are designed to keep oil air-free.

There are six oil scavenge circuits in total: one for each crank bay, one that gets oil from the front cover, and one for the cylinder heads. The oil tank itself sits right on top of the pump at the front of the engine. Engineers are particularly proud of the system's efficiency, noting that at 8600 RPM, 96 percent of the engine's oil—eight quarts of 5W50—remains in the tank. That outperforms the LT4, which only retained 68 percent of its oil in the tank at redline. There's also a bottom-mounted oil cooler, which engineers say has 85 percent more cooling capacity than the LT4's. Lee says the goal with the LT6 was to keep oil temperature below 248 degrees F on track, and in track testing, temps rarely exceeds 230. The system can handle 1.25g of lateral or longitudinal acceleration, so oil starvation shouldn't be an issue.

Of course, the oiling system is critical in making a durable engine, but it doesn't stop there. Compared with the C8 Stingray, the Z06 has two additional radiators, one in the center of the front grille, and one at the driver's side rear for oil cooling. The two outboard front radiators each get a new fan and a new compressor. For track driving, the front license plate bracket is easily removed, increasing cooling airflow to the center radiator. The LT6 even gets a larger A/C compressor and pulley compared to the LT2 in the Stingray, for those 100-degree track days. 2023 corvette z06 lt6

Chevy went fancy with the engine materials, for both strength and lightweighting. The forged titanium rods are the lightest ever in a Z06, as are the forged aluminum pistons. The pistons and mechanical finger followers get a diamond-like carbon coating to reduce friction. With no hydraulic tappets, the finger-follower valvetrain has "set for life" lash and gap, and after 100,000-mile tests, engineers saw "negligible" wear on these components. They also claimed to see no unusual oil consumption in track testing, and said the vacuum created by the new crankcase design actually helps keep the piston rings seated.

The LT6 is a radical departure from GM small-block tradition, incorporating engineering solutions commonly associated with limited-production cars without demanding the special treatment of those machines. "You get the exotic engine, but not the exotic ownership experience with extraordinary maintenance bills and frequency of maintenance," says Corvette chief engineer Tadge Juchter. "There is no special maintenance," Jordan Lee adds. "Change your oil and your filter, and change your spark plugs after 100,000 miles."

It's clear that the Corvette and Small Block teams want to win back those disappointed by the problems with the last Z06. The Z06 is supposed to be the most track-focused Corvette, and those early LT4 issues really damaged the C7 version's reputation. With the C8 Z06 and its LT6, GM engineers are looking to right those wrongs. It's an enticing promise: The most powerful naturally aspirated road-car V-8 ever, with the reliability and durability we've come to expect from a small block.

After More Than a Quarter-Century, This 1971 Corvette Found Its Way Home



The family that purchased this 1971 Corvette new didn't have to go far to track it down, 27 years after selling it.

Most all of us have sold a car **and later regretted** it at least once in our lives, whether the reason for that regret stems from the fact that the vehicle in question **later rose in value** or that we simply missed it **more than we thought we would**. The latter applies to **Riley Carroll** of the *Ford Bend Herald*, as the Texas-based journalist's family sold their beloved 1971 Corvette back in 1992 after his grandparents special ordered the Ontario Orange C3 new. However, 27 years later, that same 1971 Corvette wound up back in the family, where it belongs.

A full 26 years went by before Carroll's grandfather began reminiscing about his old Corvette and decided to search for the man he sold it to decades earlier – **Pete Sandy**. After a quick internet search, he managed to find him, and amazingly enough, Sandy still owned the car and lived a mere 20 minutes away from the Carrolls. The next, most obvious question was whether or not he would be willing to sell it back to its original owners, of course.



Sandy wasn't necessarily looking to sell the Corvette, but he couldn't resist the opportunity to return it to the folks that had made so many memories in the car over the years. "He invited me to come to the West Enders Car Club's Saturday morning car show," said Carrol's dad, Kevin. "I came out and it was kind of euphoric. I hadn't seen the car in more than 30 years and so it was really, really, special. Within a year I sent him an email and told him I would send him an offer."

The very special C3 is now back with the family that owned it originally, and it won't ever be leaving their possession again, according to Kevin. Today, it has 92k miles on the clock and is still in 100 percent original condition, right down to the tiniest flaws. "There are wear marks on the seat from my baby seat," **Kevin Carroll** said. "My brother and I remember riding in it on Saturday mornings to go get donuts."

1964 Corvette Big Tank Is One of Just 38 Produced in Total



This 1964 Corvette big tank is a very nice, recently refurbished example of a rather rare machine.

In the Corvette world, the words "big tank" almost always <u>mean rare and valuable</u>, yet another feature that made its way <u>into a select number of cars over the years</u>. Essentially just what it sounds like – a large fuel tank – this particular option wasn't chosen by a ton of people but did prove helpful in events like endurance racing, where more fuel is worth the extra weight over the course of a race. Regardless, this 1964 Corvette big tank up for grabs at *Bring a Trailer* is every bit as rare as its similarly-equipped brethren, with just 38 produced in total that particular model year.

True to its name, this 1964 Corvette big tank is far rarer than most cars from this generation thanks to the presence of GM's N03 36.5-gallon fuel tank, and it looks good as new thanks to a full refurbishment completed by the previous owner prior to 2015. The Ermine White coupe went on to garner some impressive hardware after that work, including NCRS Top Flight awards in 2017 and 2021.




On the outside, this C2 looks pretty normal with a bone stock, super white body and 15-inch steel wheels with spinner covers, which are wrapped with blue-stripe Goodyear tires. Underneath, the car features a fully independent suspension with upper and lower control arms at the front and a three-link setup with a transverse leaf spring in the rear, as well as power-assisted metallic drum brakes.



The tan vinyl interior provides a nice complement to the white exterior and is in equally amazing condition with some amenities including a heater and defroster, a Delco AM/FM radio, a reverse lockout shifter, a center-mounted electric clock, power windows, and lap belts. Under the hood, you'll find GM's venerable 327 cubic-inch L84 small block V8, which was originally rated to produce a healthy 375 horsepower and 350 pound-feet of torque, and is mated to a four-speed manual transmission and a Positraction rear end.

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
